# ANZ-Roy Morgan Australian Consumer Confidence Media Release

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\* From 3 January 2022, the interviews for the consumer confidence survey have taken place Monday to Sunday. Previously they were done at the weekend (Saturday and Sunday).

### Confidence steady as inflation expectations surge again

- 'Weekly inflation expectations' rose 0.4ppt to 6.4% last week, its highest weekly reading since June 2012. Its four-week moving average rose 0.3ppt to 5.8%.
- Consumer confidence was virtually unchanged with a decline of just 0.1%.
   Among the major states, confidence dropped in Victoria, Queensland and SA, while it increased in NSW and WA.
- The details were mixed. 'Current financial conditions' decreased by 2.5%, its third consecutive weekly decline. 'Future financial conditions' rose 1.2%.
- 'Current economic conditions' gained 6.1% after a 21.1% decline over the past five weeks. 'Future economic conditions' softened 0.6%.
- 'Time to buy a major household item' dropped by 4.3%, its third straight weekly decline.



#### ANZ Head of Australian Economics, David Plank, commented:

Inflation expectations surged 0.4ppt last week to a multi-year high of 6.4%, even though petrol prices declined slightly. Consumer confidence was essentially unchanged despite this, with a slight decline of just 0.1%. Within the detail, however, sentiment toward 'current financial conditions' dropped to its lowest since May 2020. Consumer confidence is very weak given the strength of employment, which we think is directly linked to concerns over cost-of-living pressures. It will be interesting to see whether the measures expected in the Federal Budget provide a boost to confidence.





Figure 3. 'Current financial conditions' decreased by 2.5%





Figure 4. 'Future financial conditions' rose 1.2%

Figure 5. 'Current economic conditions' increased by 6.1%






Figure 6. 'Future economic conditions' softened 0.6%
