







# Australian views on Monarchy v Republic Morgan Poll conducted on May 3/4, 2011

"In your opinion, should Australia remain a Monarchy or become a Republic with an elected President?"

- MONARCHY: 55%
- REPUBLIC: 34%
- UNDECIDED: 11%



## Australian views on Monarchy v Republic Morgan Poll conducted on May 3/4, 2011

Respondents who answered 'Monarchy' or 'Undecided' in Question 1 were then asked: "If Prince Charles were to be crowned King, in your opinion, should Australia remain a Monarchy or become a Republic with an elected President?"

- MONARCHY: 47%
- REPUBLIC: 45%
- UNDECIDED: 8%



## Australian views on Monarchy v Republic Morgan Poll conducted on May 3/4, 2011

Respondents were then asked: "If Prince William were to be crowned King, in your opinion, should Australia remain a <a href="Monarchy">Monarchy</a> or become a <a href="Republic">Republic</a> with an elected President?"

- MONARCHY: 55%
- REPUBLIC: 35%
- UNDECIDED: 10%
