


What do you think is the most important problem facing the WORLD today?


What do you think is the most important problem facing AUSTRALIA today?


What do you believe are the important ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES facing the WORLD today?








"Region important to Australia for security purposes"






"Scale of change needed to achieve Australia's optimal system of government"






"Congestion of road network in Australia's major cities"






"Broadening of Australia's immigration program"








"Most important factor influencing quality of teachers in Australia"

Good times 72% Bad times 28%


Generally, do you think now is a good time - or a bad time - for people to buy major household items?

Good time to buy 38% Bad time to buy 62%






"Strength of Australian economy in ten years time"








"Regions most important for Australia for business purposes"

Please rank the following regions in order of importance to indicate which you think is Australia's most important relationship in the region for BUSINESS PURPOSES.








"Region important to Australia for security purposes"

Please rank the following regions in order of importance to indicate which you think is Australia's most important relationship in the region for SECURITY PURPOSES.





Please indicate your level of agreement with the following statements:




- I am prepared to change behaviour to reduce my level of carbon emissions (96% 55% strongly agree)
